Western Regional Panel Monthly Executive Committee Conference Call

June 27th, 2022 at 1:00 pm mountain time

Agenda

- A) Approval of May minutes. Blaine moved to approve, and Barak seconded. All in favor Minutes approved.
- B) Panel Business
 - QZAP 2.0 Action Items Federal agencies are looking at the tasks within QZAP 2.0 and are discussing who can address various tasks by different agencies.
 - Ex Comm election Leah put an announcement in the June newsletter with a deadline of August 19th. A discussion on how to conduct the election during the annual meeting established that understanding if there will be a quorum at the meeting will determine if it will be an in-person ballot election. Snail mail-in suggested by Martha. Blaine suggested to do via survey monkey prior to and announce at the meeting. The group will re-visit in July once we have registration numbers. The preference was for simplicity.
- C) Legislative update -
 - Barak shared several items of interest, including:
 - House of Representatives passes the Recovering America's Wildlife Act that expands conservation activities eligible for funding under the Endangered Species Recovery and Habitat Conservation Legacy Fund of Title III to include efforts to manage, control, and prevent invasive species and disease.
 - ii. H.R. 6936, the Stamp Out Invasive Species Act, sponsored by Rep. Elise Stefanik (R-NY-21); Ranking Member Cliff Bentz (R-OR-2) expressed support for H.R. 6936, noting that it would advance a creative solution to raise funding for invasives species control. Rep. Jennifer González-Colón (R-PR-AL) discussed the impact of invasive species, including green iguanas, lionfish, mongooses, and feral pigs, in Puerto Rico. She asked about the challenges impacting the effectiveness of current invasive species programs and asked why awareness and public education are key components of any effort to address invasive species.
- D) WRP Standing Committee Roundtable for Chairs/Liaisons
 - Annual Meeting Committee Leah will be circulating the opportunity to host 2023 next week. Feedback on the current workshop topics resulted in some good suggestions. Including modifying HACCP to a truncated workshop. To this it was suggested 1) reading or pre-work might be a way to get things started, or 2) take through half of the process. People could identify areas where HACCP could be developed and give an examples. (Suggestion of overview 20-30 minutes and example of HACCP plan to the end, go thru what it looks like what when you go out to do, find ways to interact with the group). No HACCP certification would be offered. Theresa and Colleen will do the workshop with Barak. He will tell Leah by July 10th. Leah reported that now the day-1 lunch will be

- sponsored by Istonish. The planning team is navigating how to address invited speakers who now cannot attend in person. Prioritization was given to in-person speakers.
- Coastal Committee Co-Chairs Chris Scianni and Christine Moffitt; Glenn Dolphin Liaison. Met in May for the first time in a while; Discussion on off-shore energy development and biofouling which ties into the mobile marine infrastructure outreach in development by the committee. The group is also discussing aspects of aquaculture and disease.
- Decontamination Think Tank Committee Chair Robert Walters; Tom Woolf Liaison; no updates from the think tank. The email list of participants for the group do communicate on issues with new boats during the summer on issues and problem boats. It serves as a type of group therapy on challenging work.
- Membership and Communication Committee Chair John Wullschleger. He is initiating a poll to meet in July. This committee could use some recruitment. Brainstorm session on membership participation and effectiveness suggestions. Tammy Davis, Kelli Stockton-Fiti and Elizabeth Brown are current members of the committee. Tribes are the perennial issue of participation which could be a focus. Blaine suggested that he could chat off-line to give ideas, tribes in general don't have the depth of staff to participate in groups like this. Making the invitation correctly and asking the right person is the challenge Blaine offered to join the next committee call.

 - Review of template document to provide to membership. First step is to have Kate address the edits from the Ex-Comm. There was discussion on the need for the document to be properly socialized with the right people in fire to ensure it gets used in fire community. It could be shared with others in fire Mike Illmini of Forest Service may review or have suggestions. Regional forest service staff have commented but it is limited. Having another step of review and getting broader feedback is needed. Ex comm comments to Leah by end week and then will send on to Kate.
